2 Peter 1:21 "For no prophecy [of Scripture] was ever made by an act of the human will, but men, moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God."

Exodus 20:1 "Then God spoke all these words saying . . ."

Isaiah 1:2 "Listen, O heavens, and hear, O earth; for the Lord speaks..."

Jeremiah 1:1-2 "The words of Jeremiah...to whom the word of the Lord came..."

Psalm 95:7b-8 "Today, if you would hear His voice, do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as in the day of Massah in the wilderness,"

Hebrews 3:7 "Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says, 'Today if you hear His voice,'"

- Manner of His death (Psalm 22:16),
- People's reaction to His death (Psalm 22:7, 8),
- His burial in a rich man's tomb (Isaiah 53:9).
